2018 NJAC Champions 20th Annual Regents Cup Champions

Setting the Scene

The sixth-ranked Bobcats host an NCAA Playoff game this Saturday for just the second time in program history when they welcome the Western New England Golden Bears to Bobcat Stadium for the first round at noon. Frostburg wrapped up the regular season at 9-0 last Saturday with a thrilling 38-35 OT win over Salisbury and this Saturday's playoff contest will serve as FSU's fifth home game this year. WNE carries an 8-2 overall record into the game after it defeated Becker last weekend 52-0 to secure the Commonwealth Coast Conference title.

The Bobcats are 9-0 for just the second time in program history and they are hosting an NCAA Playoff game for the first time since 1993, when FSU hosted a quarterfinal game against nationally-ranked Washington & Jefferson.

The Bobcats needed overtime last Saturday to down in-state rival Salisbury and capture their first outright New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) trophy. Two years ago, Frostburg was crowned tri-Champions and captured an ECAC Bowl game victory over St. John Fisher to close the season.

Frostburg closed the regular season having won 27 of its last 29 regular-season contests and the Bobcats have won 17 of their last 18 home games. FSU has also won its last six home games.

WNE collected a seven-game winning streak over the middle part of its schedule after dropping its season opener to Springfield. The Golden Bears closed the season with a loss at Endicott (41-38) and a win vs. Becker (52-0) to earn their league's automatic bid to the playoffs.

The Series

The first round playoff game between Frostburg and Western New England will be the first-ever meeting between the two schools.

Scouting Western New England

Western New England (8-2, 5-1 CCC) is under the direction of first-year head coach Jason Lebeau, who spent the previous eight seasons as an assistant coach with the Golden Bears, including six seasons as the offensive coordinator. With Lebeau as their OC, the Golden Bears captured three-straight conference titles and in 2016 the team participated in their first NCAA Tournament. Lebeau was named the 2016 New England Division III Assistant Coach of the Year by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston for his efforts in leading the WNE offense to 41.0 points per game and 460.5 yards per game, both ranked second in the New England Football Conference. Lebeau was a three-year starter on the offensive line during his playing days with the Golden Bears and as a senior, he won the team's offensive MVP award. He also was selected to the 2009 All-NEFC Boyd Division First Team and was a three-time NEFC Academic Team selection.

Last week, Western New England clinched its fourth-straight conference title with their 52-0 victory over Becker at home. The Golden Bears scored four touchdowns in the second quarter to break the game open and hold a 38-0 lead going into halftime. The team's defense forced five turnovers and held Becker to just 179 yards of total offense.

The Golden Bears averaged 44.8 points per game during the regular season, which was the ninth-best point total in the country. Their offense relies heavily on the ground attack, as they averaged 265.1 rushing yards per game, ranked 14th in the nation. Overall, WNE averaged 464.2 yards of total offense per game, making them the 21st-best offense in Division III.

Junior quarterback Alec Coleman leads the Golden Bear offense both through the air and on the ground. Coleman threw the ball for 1,666 yards and 20 touchdowns against just three interceptions. He has also rushed for a team-leading 818 yards and 18 scores. His 18 touchdown runs led the CCC and was tied for the sixth-most in the nation. In the Golden Bears' victory over Curry this season, Coleman completed 19 passes for 273 yards and four touchdowns. He also added 41 rushing yards and a rushing score in the 56-21 win.

Junior running back Peter Hoff carried the ball 143 times this season for 709 yards and eight touchdowns. His best performance came in the Golden Bears' 41-14 victory on the road against Salve Regina. He ran for 204 yards on 23 carries, including a 67-yard scamper into the endzone late in the fourth quarter. Sophomore wide receiver Adam Razza hauled in 24 catches, three for touchdowns, and a team-leading 496 yards. His long on the season was a 64-yard catch and run into the endzone in the Golden Bears' victory over Curry.

Defensively, WNE allowed 315.0 yards per game, including 151.5 yards allowed on the ground per game. The Golden Bear defense held opposing passers to 163.5 yards per game, which was ranked 32nd in the country. Their defensive unit also allowed 20.3 points per game. Senior linebacker Mike Chirco leads the charge for the Western New England defense, as he collected 78 tackles, eight of which came behind the line of scrimmage, and 3.5 sacks. Senior linebacker Kurtis Jolicoeur led the squad with 15 tackles for loss while his classmate and defensive lineman Ryan Smith collected a team-high four sacks.

Scouting Frostburg

Frostburg ended its regular season with a 38-35 overtime victory last week over in-state rival Salisbury to clinch their second New Jersey Athletic Conference championship and its first undefeated regular season in program history.

Head coach DeLane Fitzgerald is currently in his fifth season at the helm for the Bobcats. He is the program's all-time winningest coach with 40 wins and this is the second consecutive season he has led the team to the NCAA Tournament.

In last week's victory over Salisbury, Frostburg took advantage of great field position after a bad snap to the Sea Gull punter to score the game-tying touchdown with 1:37 left in the fourth quarter, which forced the game into overtime with a 35-35 score. In the overtime period, sophomore kicker Jeremy Harrison kicked a 37-yard field goal attempt through the uprights to give the Bobcats a 38-35 lead. On the first play of Salisbury's ensuing drive, junior defensive lineman Paul Kumper forced a fumble from the hands of Sea Gull quarterback Frank Papich which was recovered by sophomore Avery Thurman to seal the victory.

The Frostburg offense is ranked 17th in the nation and led the NJAC in scoring, averaging 42.1 points per game, while the offensive unit averaged 414.8 yards per game.

Senior quarterback Connor Cox led the Bobcat aerial attack, throwing for 1887 yards and 23 touchdowns, which led the NJAC. Cox was also a threat to run the ball this season, as he collected six touchdowns on the ground. In last week's game against Salisbury, Cox threw for 215 yards and four touchdowns. Cox often found junior wide receiver Malik Morris through the air, as he hauled in 31 receptions for 824 yards and seven touchdowns, all of which led the Bobcats. Morris was also ranked first in the country in yards per reception with 26.58, while Cox was ranked third in the country in yards per pass attempt with 10.31.

On the ground, the Bobcats are led by senior running back Jamaal Morant, who rushed for 749 yards and eight touchdowns. In the Bobcats' 35-34 victory over Wesley earlier this season, Morant ran the ball for a season-high 162 yards and a touchdown on 30 carries.

Defensively, the Bobcats have allowed 229.2 yards per game to opposing offenses, good for the ninth-best mark in the nation and is third in the nation in pass yards allowed, holding opposing quarterbacks to 115.8 yards per game. The defensive unit also allowed 13.3 points per game, the 24th-lowest points per game allowed in Division III. FSU is led by senior linebacker Dre'Quan Reed, who leads the team with 59 tackles, 8.5 of which has come behind the line of scrimmage and five sacks. Sophomore defensive lineman Zach Strand has the team lead with 11.5 tackles for losses and six sacks.

Frostburg has sacked opposing quarterbacks an average of four times a game in the regular season, which is ranked sixth in the nation and first in the NJAC. FSU also led the nation in fewest first downs allowed, giving up 107 the entire season. The defensive unit has also gained 23 turnovers and lost only 10, giving it a turnover margin of 13.

Head Coach DeLane Fitzgerald

DeLane Fitzgerald is in his fifth season at the helm of Frostburg and has pushed the program to new heights in a short amount of time. He has guided the Bobcats to 40 wins in five seasons, including 10 wins in 2016 and 11 wins last fall. Fitzgerald has increased his win total in each of his four previous seasons after inheriting a 1-9 team.

In a week four win over Rowan, Fitzgerald became the program's all-time winningest coach with 34 victories. He is the 13th head coach in the program's 58-year history.

Fitzgerald was one of 23 head football coaches hired in 2014 in Division III. Among those 23, he is tied for second with 40 wins, but is the only coach in the group with two 10+ win seasons.

Thirty is a Magic Number

The Bobcats have scored over 30 points in eight of their nine games this season, and 11 of their last 12 games overall dating back to 2017. Under DeLane Fitzgerald, the Bobcats are 24-1 when scoring 30 or more.

The Rankings

Frostburg remained at sixth in both the D3football.com Top 25 Poll and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Top 25 Poll defeated Salisbury 38-35 in OT. FSU has been ranked inside the top 10 in both polls all season.

Tough To Come By

In his four-plus seasons at the helm, Fitzgerald has led the Bobcats to a 25-1 record when holding opponents to less than 100 yards rushing.

Frostburg has allowed just two 100 yard rushers this season and both came against Salisbury and its triple option attack.

First To Score

In their four home games this season, the Bobcats have scored first and the 38-35 overtime win over Salisbury marked the 25th-consecutive victory when scoring first. Under DeLane Fitzgerald, FSU is 33-3 overall when having the initial score.

At Home

Frostburg has won 17 of its last 18 home games dating back to the start of the 2016 season with its 31-10 victory over Geneva.

The Bobcats are currently riding a six-game winning streak at Bobcat Stadium and are outscoring their opponents by nearly 34 points during those six matchups.

Home Wins

Over the last two seasons, Frostburg has lost just once at Bobcat Stadium and is 12-1 during that span.

I'll Take Scoring For 100

Through nine games, the Frostburg offense is averaging 42.1 points per game, leading the NJAC and sitting at 17th in the nation.

Through nine games of last year's record setting season, the Bobcats were averaging 38.8 points per contest. The '17 squad went on to set a school record with 468 points in 13 games, an average of 36 points per contest.

I'll take that

The Frostburg defense has intercepted 10 passes and pounced on 13 fumbles this fall, but it's the turnover margin that is most impressive.

Frostburg leads the NJAC and is 10th in Division III in turnover margin as it has turned the ball over just 11 times in nine games. The Bobcats have generated two or more turnovers in seven of their nine games this season.



81 And Counting

Through nine games in his senior season, Bobcat signal caller Connor Cox is currently seventh in Division III among active quarterbacks with 81 career touchdowns.

This season, Cox has tossed 23 touchdown passes to just two interceptions.

By Land and Air

Cox is one of 10 active quarterbacks in Division III who have thrown for 4,000 yards and run for 1,000 in their career. Of those 10 QBs, Cox is fourth in total yards amassing 8,935 total yards behind 7,711 passing and 1,224 rushing yards.

Postseason

DeLane Fitzgerald has been at the helm of the Bobcat program for five seasons and he has quickly turned Frostburg into a team that competes for a postseason every season.

After inheriting a 1-9 squad, Fitzgerald had the Bobcats in an ECAC Bowl in just three seasons and the Bobcats are making back-to-back NCAA Playoff appearances for the only time in school history.

This fall marks the first time Frostburg has ever earned three-straight trips to the postseason.

30 and Counting

Over the last three seasons, the Bobcats have collected 30 wins following 10 wins in '16, 11 victories a year ago and a 9-0 start to this season.

The previous three-year record for most victories was 27 set by the 1989, 1990 and 1991 squads.

Big Play Threat

Bobcat junior receiver Malik Morris currently leads the nation in yards per reception at 26.58. In the season opener, he hauled in a 92-yard pass in the first quarter, while in the win over Rowan, he scored the game's first touchdown with a 68-yard pitch-and-catch from senior Connor Cox.

Last Saturday, Morris hauled in touchdowns passes of 68 and 48 yards in the first quarter of FSU's 38-35 overtime win over Salisbury.

November

Frostburg football has continued to dominate the month of November. With the Bobcats' 38-35 overtime victory over Salisbury last Saturday, the Bobcats won their ninth-straight game in the month of November. That streak includes a 3-0 November in 2016 with an ECAC bowl victory and a 4-0 November last season with two NCAA Playoff wins.
