2018 NJAC Champions 20th Annual Regents Cup Champions

#### Setting the Scene

The sixth-ranked Bobcats host 13/14th-ranked Johns Hopkins this Saturday at Bobcat Stadium in the second round of the 2018 NCAA Playoffs at noon.

Frostburg earned a trip to the second round after downing Western New England 42-24 last Saturday in the first home NCAA Playoff game for the Bobcats since 1993. John Hopkins will travel to Western Maryland after shutting out MIT 49-0 in the first round at historic Homewood Field in Baltimore.

The Bobcats are 10-0 for the first time in the 58-year history of the Bobcat football program and are looking to match last year's school record with 11 wins.

Frostburg enters Saturday's matchup having won 18 of its last 19 home games, including the last seven in a row.

JHU carries a nine-game winning streak into the second round and is averaging nearly 48 points per game during those nine victories. The Blue Jays, who won at least a share of the Centennial Conference in each of the last nine seasons, are making their eighth-consecutive trip to the NCAA Playoffs

#### The Series

The Bobcats and Blue Jays have met just once before on the gridiron back in 2002 in an ECAC Bowl game, which Johns Hopkins won 24-21.

#### Scouting Johns Hopkins

Johns Hopkins (10-1, 8-1 CC) is under the direction of head coach Jim Margraff, who has been leading the Blue Jays for the last 29 years. Margraff's 219 wins puts him atop the list as the all-time winningest coach in the program's history. In addition, he has the most career victories of any college football coach in Maryland State history. Margraff has been named the Centennial Conference Coach of the Year four different times and an AFCA Region 2 Coach of the Year on three separate occasions. Margraff is no stranger to the postseason, as he has led the Blue Jays to the NCAA Tournament for eight-straight seasons and 10 total times in his tenure. Magraff was a four-year starting quarterback at Johns Hopkins in his playing days, and he ranked as the program's all-time leader in pass attempts, completions, passing yards and touchdown passes at the time of his graduation.

Last week, Johns Hopkins defeated MIT in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, 49-0 at home. The Blue Jays scored six touchdowns in the first half, four of which came in the second quarter to hold a commanding 42-0 halftime lead. In total, the JHU offense had 397 passing yards and 677 total yards in the game.

This season, the Blue Jays have averaged 47.8 points per game, which is the

sixth-best point total in the country. Their offense is ranked as the best in all of Division III football, averaging 560.8 yards per game and it boasts the fourth-best aerial attack, averaging 351.4 passing yards per game.

Junior quarterback David Tammara leads the Blue Jays offense through the air, as he has thrown for 3,330 yards so far this season in 11 games, currently ranked third in the country and second in Johns Hopkins football history behind Jonathan Germano's 3,593 passing yards he threw for in 2016. Tammara also threw for 3,010 yards last season, making him the only quarterback to throw for more than 3,000 yards twice in his career at JHU. Tammara has thrown 31 touchdown passes, tied for ninth-most in the country this season and the third-most in JHU history behind Germano's 35 in 2015 and 33 in 2016. This season, Tammara has thrown for over 300 yards five times, including a 420-yard performance in the Blue Jays' 47-3 victory over Moravian earlier this season.

Senior running back Stuart Walters leads the Blue Jays' rushing attack with 809 yards on the ground and 15 touchdowns. His 15 scores are the tied for the 18th most in the nation. Walters has also hauled in 16 passes this season for 286 yards, giving him 1,095 total yards this season to lead the team. In JHU's regular season finale, Walters ran for 120 yards and three touchdowns in his team's 42-17 victory over McDaniel. Sophomore receiver Ryan Hubley leads the Blue Jays with 770 yards and seven touchdown grabs. In Johns Hopkins' 42-12 win over Franklin & Marshall earlier this season, Hubley brought in a season-high 12 catches for 107 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensively, JHU allowed 281.6 yards per game, including 115.9 yards allowed on the ground per game. The Blue Jays' defensive unit has allowed 13.6 points per game the 24th-best in the country. Freshman linebacker Robert Fletcher leads the charge for the defense, as he has collected 66 tackles, four of which came behind the line of scrimmage. The Blue Jays' defensive line gets into the offensive backfield often, as junior Mike Kalanik and senior Anthony Davidson leads the team with 15.5 and 10 tackles for loss respectively. Kalanik leads the team with 10 quarterback sacks.

#### Scouting Frostburg

Frostburg cruises into the second round of the NCAA Tournament after its 42-24 home victory over Western New England in the tournament's first round.

Head coach DeLane Fitzgerald is currently in his fifth season at the helm for the Bobcats. He is the program's all-time winningest coach with 41 wins and this is the second consecutive season he has led the team to the NCAA Tournament. Last season, the Bobcats made it to the quarterfinals after winning their first two games of the tournament.

In last week's victory over the Golden Bears, Frostburg scored at least one touchdown in each quarter. Senior quarterback Connor Cox threw for a career-high 381 yards and three touchdowns in the win. Sophomore running back Malcolm Facey led the rushing attack with a career-high 112 yards and a touchdown in the effort.

This season, the Frostburg offense is ranked 16th in the nation and leads the NJAC in scoring, averaging 42.1 points per game, while averaging 431.5 yards per game.

Cox leads the Bobcat aerial attack, throwing for 2,268 yards and 26 touchdowns, which leads the NJAC. Cox was also a threat to run the ball this season, as he has collected six touchdowns on the ground.

Cox often finds junior wide receiver Malik Morris through the air, as he has hauled in 42 receptions for 1,009 yards and nine touchdowns, all of which leads the Bobcats. Morris is just the second player to record 1,000 or more yards in a season in the program's history, behind Bill Bagely's 1,182-yard season in 1984. Morris is also ranked fourth in the country in yards per reception with 24.02, while Cox is currently ranked second in the country in yards per pass attempt with 10.85.

On the ground, the Bobcats are led by senior running back Jamaal Morant, who has rushed for 796 yards and eight touchdowns. In the Bobcats' 35-34 victory over Wesley earlier this season, Morant ran the ball for a season-high 162 yards and a touchdown on 30 carries.

Defensively, the Bobcats have allowed 252.0 yards per game to opposing offenses, good for the 15th-best mark in the nation and are sixth in the nation in pass yards allowed, holding opposing quarterbacks to 140.8 yards per game. The defensive unit also allowed 14.4 points per game, the 29th-lowest points per game allowed in Division III. FSU is led by senior linebacker Dre'Quan Reed, who leads the team with 63 tackles, 8.5 of which has come behind the line of scrimmage and five sacks. Sophomore defensive lineman Zach Strand has the team lead with 13.5 tackles for losses and six sacks.

Frostburg has sacked opposing quarterbacks an average of 3.7 times a game in the regular season, which is ranked 11th in the nation and first in the NJAC. FSU is also towards the top of the list in allowing the fewest first downs, giving up 134 the entire season, ranked ninth in the country.

#### Head Coach DeLane Fitzgerald

DeLane Fitzgerald is in his fifth season at the helm of Frostburg and has pushed the program to new heights in a short amount of time. He has guided the Bobcats to 41 wins in five seasons, including 10 wins in 2016 and 11 wins last fall. Fitzgerald has increased his win total in each of his four previous seasons after inheriting a 1-9 team.

In a week four win over Rowan, Fitzgerald became the program's all-time winningest coach with 34 victories. He is the 13th head coach in the program's 58-year history.

Fitzgerald was one of 23 head football coaches hired in 2014 in Division III. Among those 23, he is tied for second with 41 wins, but is the only coach in the group with two 10+ win seasons.

### Thirty is a Magic Number

The Bobcats have scored over 30 points in nine of their 10 games this season, and 12 of their last 13 games overall dating back to 2017. Under DeLane Fitzgerald, the Bobcats are 25-1 when scoring 30 or more.

### Tough To Come By

In his four-plus seasons at the helm, Fitzgerald has led the Bobcats to a 26-1 record when holding opponents to less than 100 yards rushing.

Frostburg has allowed just two 100 yard rushers this season and both came against Salisbury and its triple option attack.

### First To Score

In their five home games this season, the Bobcats have scored first and the 42-24 win over Western New England in the NCAA Playoffs last Saturday marked the 26th-consecutive victory when scoring first. Under DeLane Fitzgerald, FSU is 34-3 overall when having the initial score.

### At Home

Frostburg has won 18 of its last 19 home games dating back to the start of the 2016 season with its 31-10 victory over Geneva.

The Bobcats are currently riding a seven-game winning streak at Bobcat Stadium and are outscoring their opponents by over 31 points during those seven matchups.

### Home Wins

Over the last two seasons, Frostburg has lost just once at Bobcat Stadium and is 13-1 during that span.

### I'll Take Scoring For 100

Through 10 games, the Frostburg offense is averaging 42.1 points per game, leading the NJAC and sitting at 16th in the nation.

Through 10 games of last year's record setting season, the Bobcats were averaging 35.0 points per contest. The '17 squad went on to set a school record with 468 points in 13 games, an average of 36 points per contest.

This year's Bobcat squad needs just 47 yards to tie the school mark and 48 points to establish a new record.

### I'll take that

The Frostburg defense has intercepted 12 passes and pounced on 13 fumbles this fall, but it's the turnover margin that is most impressive.

Frostburg leads the NJAC and is 12th in Division III in turnover margin as it has turned the ball over just 13 times in 10 games. The Bobcats have generated two or more turnovers in eight of their 10 games this season.

### 84 And Counting

Through 10 games in his senior season, Bobcat signal caller Connor Cox is currently eighth in Division III among active quarterbacks with 84 career touchdowns.

This season, Cox has tossed 26 touchdown passes to just three interceptions.



### By Land and Air

Cox is one of 10 active quarterbacks in Division III who have thrown for 4,000 yards and run for 1,000 in their career. Of those 10 QBs, Cox is fourth in total yards amassing 9,339 total yards behind 8,092 passing and 1,247 rushing yards.

### Postseason

DeLane Fitzgerald has been at the helm of the Bobcat program for five seasons and he has quickly turned Frostburg into a team that competes for a postseason every season.

After inheriting a 1-9 squad, Fitzgerald had the Bobcats in an ECAC Bowl in just three seasons and the Bobcats are making back-to-back NCAA Playoff appearances for the only time in school history.

This fall marks the first time Frostburg has ever earned three-straight trips to the postseason.

### 31 and Counting

Over the last three seasons, the Bobcats have collected 31 wins following 10 wins in '16, 11 victories a year ago and a 10-0 start to this season.

The previous three-year record for most victories was 27 set by the 1989, 1990 and 1991 squads.

### Big Play Threat

Bobcat junior receiver Malik Morris is fourth in the nation in yards per reception at 24.02. In the season opener, he hauled in a 92-yard pass in the first quarter, while in the win over Rowan, he scored the game's first touchdown with a 68-yard pitch-and-catch from senior Connor Cox.

Last Saturday, Morris carved up the Western New England secondary to the tune of 11 receptions for 185 yards and two touchdowns. He posted receptions of 37, 28, 35 and 44 yards.

### November

Frostburg football has continued to dominate the month of November. With the Bobcats' 42-24 win over Western New England last Saturday, the Bobcats won their 10th-straight game in the month of November. That streak includes a 3-0 November in 2016 with an ECAC bowl victory and a 4-0 November last season with two NCAA Playoff wins.
