Frostburg senior QB Connor Cox returns to lead the Bobcat offense in 2018

Setting the Scene

Coming off arguably the best season in program history, Frostburg charges into the 2018 campaign ranked eighth in the D3football.com Preseason Top 25 poll and will visit Mustang Stadium to battle Stevenson on Thursday night.

Last fall, Frostburg posted an 11-2 overall record that included a run to the NCAA playoff quarterfinals. FSU knocked off No. 9 Wittenberg (35-7) and No. 10 Washington & Jefferson (46-23) in the first two rounds of the playoffs.

This season marks the second-straight year that Frostburg and Stevenson will face one another to open the season. The Bobcats downed the 18th-ranked Mustangs 33-7 at Bobcat Stadium last fall.

Stevenson is coming off a 6-5 campaign that included a 29-16 loss to Alfred in the ECAC's James Lynch Bowl. The bowl game marked the fourth-straight season that SU competed in the postseason.

The Series

Thursday's matchup between Frostburg and Stevenson is just the second meeting between the two Maryland schools.

Both teams were ranked heading into last year's contest as Frostburg sat at 17th in the poll, while the Mustangs were 18th. The Bobcats cruised to a 33-7 win behind a dominating defense performance and the win was the first of three over a ranked opponent on the season.

Scouting Stevenson

Stevenson is coming off a six-win campaign a year ago, following nine-win seasons in both 2015 and 2016 and eight victories in 2014.

The Mustangs are coached by Frostburg alum Ed Hottle ('99), who has guided his team to 46 wins in seven seasons at the helm. Hottle is the only coach in program history as SU posted its first season of varsity football in 2011. Prior to Stevenson, Hottle led Gallaudet to 27 wins over five seasons.

Last year, the Mustangs had a potent offense that averaged over 400 yards per contest (403.1 ypg) behind the nation's 21st-ranked passing game (305.4).

Dan Williams returns under center to power the Mustang offense and he is entering his third year as the starting quarterback. He holds the program's all-time passing records for completions (508), attempts (853), yards (6,026) and touchdowns (55).

Williams lost his two best pass catchers, Devin Salisbury and Preston Addo, to

graduation, however, Sebastian Vainqueur returns after catching three TDs a year ago. The offensive line returns All-MAC performers Connor Davis and Brendan Flaherty and the running game will be bolstered by the return of Daqwan Hill (269 yards.)

The Mustang defense returns eight of 11 starters and will be led by two-time All-MAC honoree Ashton Leschke, who finished with 79 tackles a year ago.

Scouting Frostburg

Frostburg enters the 2018 campaign as one of the hottest teams in Division III with 21 wins over the last two seasons including two post-season appearances. Head coach DeLane Fitzgerald has increased Frostburg's win total in each of four seasons at the helm after taking over a 1-9 program prior to his arrival.

Last fall, the Bobcats were part of the national playoff equation all season and finished with a school record 11 wins. Frostburg spent the entire season ranked inside the top 25, collected three wins against ranked opponents, beat two of Division III's winningest programs and was one of the final eight teams left standing in the NCAA Playoffs.

Prior to losing to eventual national champion Mount Union in the NCAA Playoffs, Frostburg collected seven-straight wins and outscored its opponents during that stretch by nearly 30 points. The Bobcats knocked off No. 9 Wittenberg (35-7) and No. 10 Washington & Jefferson (46-23) in the first two rounds of the playoffs, DIII's second and third winningest programs of all-time, respectively.

The Bobcats scored a school record 468 points during the 13-game '17 campaign and averaged nearly 420 yards per game in offense (418.4 ypg). FSU ranked 39th in the nation in scoring (36.0) and averaged almost 40 points per game in its three playoff games.

The Frostburg defense might be even more impressive as it ranked 16th in DIII in total defense (265.6) and 13th in the country in rushing defense (82.2). The Bobcats held three opponents to negative yardage and allowed just three teams to rush for more than 100 yards in a game.

The Bobcat offense has the potential to improve on last year's numbers as several key returners return for their final seasons.

Senior quarterback Connor Cox enters his final year having started the previous three seasons while amassing 5,824 passing yards. He is FSU's all-time leader with 58 career TD passes. The backfield duo of seniors Jamaal Morant and Grayson Boyce combined for over 1,000 yards on the ground with 17 touchdowns last season. Boyce scored six times in the first four games, while Morant has rushed for 1,808 yards and 15 TDs in two seasons with Frostburg.

Senior wideout Sergio Andino burst on the scene as a junior, hauling in 41 passes for 634 yards and 13 touchdowns. He capped his season with 105 yards on five catches and a touchdown against Mount Union. The offensive line will also be laden with seniors as O'Shane McCall, Joey Powell and Riley Hartman return after each started all 13 games a year ago.

On defense, senior Dre'Quan Reed and juniors Matt Meier and Wayne Palmer will lead the way at linebacker. Meier played in all 13 games and made 35 tackles, Palmer notched 19 tackles, while Reed is coming off an injury. In the secondary, junior Vincent Persichetti started 11 games and made 25 total tackles, while senior Anthony Taylor played in all 13 games and made 21 stops.

On the defensive line, senior Boakum Vital made 13 tackles in 12 games last fall and junior Paul Kumbar added 12 stops in 13 games. Sophomore Zach Strand was twice named the NJAC Rookie of the Week after a standout first year. He total 30 tackles, including 14 tackles for loss and 10 sacks.

Head Coach DeLane Fitzgerald

DeLane Fitzgerald is entering his fifth season at the helm of Frostburg and has pushed the program to new heights in a short amount of time. He has guided the Bobcats to 31 wins in four years, including 10 wins in 2016 and 11 wins last fall. Fitzgerald has increased his win total in each of his four seasons after inheriting a 1-9 team.

Last fall, Frostburg posted a school record 11 wins (11-2), upset three nationally-ranked teams, advanced to the NCAA Playoff quarterfinals and ranked ninth in both major polls at season's end.

Fitzgerald was one of 23 head football coaches hired in 2014 in Division III. Among those 23, he is third with 31 wins, but is the only coach in the group with two 10+ win seasons.

Fitzgerald - Season Openers

Fitzgerald has been perfect in season openers at the helm of Frostburg, guiding the Bobcats to four wins in his previous four seasons. FSU defeated Geneva 24-19 (2014), 52-21 (2015) and 31-10 (2016) over Fitzgerald's first three years. Last fall, the Bobcats defeated 18th-ranked Stevenon 33-7 at Bobcat Stadium.

Fitzgerald - At Night

Fitzgerald's teams at Frostburg have also been perfect under the lights, winning all nine contests that have kicked off after 6:00 pm. Last fall, the Bobcats won all three night games and averaged over 33 points per game. In night games away from Bobcat Stadium, Fitzgerald is 5-0.

The Rankings

Frostburg enters the 2018 season ranked eighth in the D3football.com Pre-season Top 25 Poll. The Bobcats finished last season ranked ninth in both the D3football.com and American Football Coaches Association Top 25 polls.

Program History

Frostburg is in its 58th year of collegiate football in 2018 and the Bobcats have an overall record of 266-281-8. The Bobcats have made two appearances in the NCAA Playoffs (1993 & 2017) and have played in eight ECAC Bowl Games.

Road Wins

Over the last two seasons, Frostburg has lost just twice away from Bobcat Stadium and is 11-2 in away and neutral site games.

Oh Captain, My Captain

A quintuple of Frostburg players will serve as team captains for Thursday's matchup with Stevenson: seniors Riley Hartman, Noah Teeter, Dre'Quan Reed, Boakum Vital and Grayson Boyce.

Elite Company

In 2016 and 2017, the Bobcats posted back-to-back double-digit win seasons for the first time in program history. Only six other programs in Division III accomplished the same feat in the past two seasons (Mount Union, Mary Hardin-Baylor, UW-Oshkosh, St. Thomas, North Central and Wittenberg).

FSU is one of 12 teams to reach the national quarterfinals in the same timespan.

58 And Counting

Senior signal caller Connor Cox enters his final season ranked sixth in DIII among active quarterbacks with 58 career touchdowns.

By Land and Air

Cox is one of six active quarterbacks in Division III who have thrown for 4,000 yards and run for 1,000 in their career. Of those six QBs, Cox is third in total yards amassing 6,851 total yards behind 5,824 passing and 1,027 rushing yards.

You Know Sergio

Senior wideout Senior Andino set the Frostburg single-season record with 13 touchdown receptions last fall. He caught a TD pass in nine-straight games to close the season and hauled in multiple scoring passes against William Paterson, Montclair, Southern Virginia and Kean.

Big Play Threat

Bobcat junior receiver Malik Morris was second in the NJAC last season in yards per reception at 18.6. All five of his touchdown receptions were 20 yards or greater (57, 43, 72, 46, 20).
