Setting the Scene

The sixth-ranked Bobcats hit the road for the final time this regular season when they visit Kean for a 1:00 pm showdown this Saturday. The matchup is the fifth road contest of the fall season for the Bobcats and marks their third trip to the state of New Jersey. Frostburg is 7-0 for the first time since 1994, while the Cougars are just 1-7 and have lost their last three games.

The Bobcats are looking for their first 8-0 start since 1993 and it will be just the third 8-0 or better start in program history.

Last Saturday, Frostburg nearly shut out Southern Virginia 61-7 as the Knights scored a late fourth-quarter touchdown to avoid the zero on the scoreboard. Senior QB Connor Cox accounted for sixth touchdowns and was named the NJAC Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

Since the start of the 2016 season, Frostburg has won 25 of its last 27 regular-season contests and the Bobcats have won 15 of their last 17 home games dating back to the midway point of the 2015 campaign. On the flip side, Frostburg has won its last 12 regular-season road games and hasn't lost in the state of New Jersey since late in the '15 campaign.

The Cougars opened the season with four-consecutive losses before collecting their first victory at William Paterson (16-0) in early October. Kean has since lost three-straight games and has scored just 17 points in those three defeats.

Kean was picked to finish fourth in the NJAC Preseason Poll but sits at just 1-7 overall and 1-6 in the NJAC.

The Series

Saturday's matchup between Frostburg and Kean is the fifth between the two schools and the Bobcats lead the series 3-1.

Kean won the first game between the two in 1994 in an ECAC Bowl Game, 41-7, at Bobcat Stadium. However, since joining the NJAC prior to the 2015 season, the Bobcats have won all three meetings.

A year ago, Frostburg downed the Cougars 17-14 at Bobcat Stadium for its fourth-straight win heading into its regular-season finale with Salisbury.

Scouting Kean

Kean (1-7, 1-6 NJAC) is under the direction of head coach Dan Garrett, who is currently in his 13th season at the helm for the Cougars. Garrett took over the Kean head coaching position in 2006 after spending three years as the Cougars'

defensive coordinator. Garret has been in the NJAC ever since his college days at Montclair State University, where he played linebacker and defensive end and twice earned First Team All-NJAC honors. Immediately after his playing days, he signed on to be an assistant coach and defensive coordinator with MSU until he was hired by Kean in 2003. In his 13 seasons, Garret has led Kean to 72 victories, three ECAC Southeast Bowl Championships, a NJAC Championship and its first-ever NCAA Tournament victory.

Last week, Kean suffered its third-straight loss, losing to Christopher Newport on the road, 13-3. The Cougars only managed 111 total yards of offense, turning the ball over three times and allowing six sacks.

Through eight games, the Cougars are averaging 166.7 yards per game, ranked last in the nation, with only 54.1 rushing yards per game, the 237th ranked rushing attack in Division III. Also, Kean is scoring an average of 5.3 points per game, which is also ranked at the bottom of the nation.

Senior quarterback Rylan Pangborn leads the aerial attack for the Cougars. He has thrown for 827 yards and three touchdowns in seven games this season, averaging 118.1 yards per game. Pangborn frequently looks for junior wide receiver David Patterson, Jr., who is leading the Cougars with 264 receiving yards and two touchdown grabs. In Kean's game against Southern Virginia, Pangborn connected with Campbell a season-high six times for 44 yards and a touchdown in the 14-9 loss.

On the ground, the Cougars look to junior running back Paris Crawford, who leads their squad with 390 yards, an average of 48.8 yards per game. He has also hauled in 17 receptions for 115 yards. Crawford, who also acts as Kean's kick and punt returner, is ranked 84th in the nation and second in the NJAC with 121.5 all-purpose yards per game.

Defensively, Kean is allowing 305.4 yards per game and 23.9 points per game to opposing offenses, both of which rank fifth in the NJAC. The Cougars' leading tackler is linebacker Dante Caozzoli with 71 stops, 5.5 of which came behind the line for a loss of yards. Freshman defensive back Anthony Bassani has intercepted four passes so far this season, good for the third most in the conference.

Scouting Frostburg

Frostburg enters the game at 7-0 after its 61-7 homecoming victory over Southern Virginia last week at Bobcat Stadium. The Bobcats are 7-0 for the first time since 1994, and a win against Kean would give the Bobcats their first 8-0 start since 1993.

Head coach DeLane Fitzgerald is currently in his fifth season at the helm for the Bobcats. He is the program's all-time winningest coach with 38 wins and he led the Bobcats to the NCAA Playoffs last fall.

Frostburg was dominate in last week's victory over SVU, scoring 61-straight points before the Knights found the endzone with 6:33 remaining in the fourth quarter. Senior quarterback Conner Cox completed 12 of his 15 throws for 201 yards and five touchdowns, giving him a total of 16 touchdown passes on the season, second best in the NJAC. He also added a rushing touchdown to his ledger, giving him his fifth rushing touchdown on the campaign.

Junior wide receiver Malik Morris added to his impressive season, as he hauled in four catches for 104 yards and two touchdowns. Morris currently leads the team in receptions (25), yards (672) and touchdown grabs (5). Morris and Cox have helped each other out with their connection on big plays, as Morris is currently third in the nation in yards per reception (26.88) and Cox is currently second in the nation in yards per pass attempt (10.64).

Senior running back Jamaal Morant added to his team-lead last week, as he pounded his way into the endzone from three yards out for his seventh rushing touchdown of the year. Morant also leads the team with 529 yards on the ground, averaging 75.6 yards in his seven games.

The Frostburg offense is currently ranked 19th in the country and is leading the league in scoring (41.6).

Defensively, the Bobcats are allowing 217.1 yards per game to opposing offenses, good for the eighth-best mark in the nation and third-best in the NJAC. FSU is led by senior linebacker Dre'Quan Reed, who leads the team with 47 tackles. Reed and sophomore defensive lineman Zach Strand are tied for the team lead with 7.5 tackles for losses, including four sacks for each of them.

Frostburg has sacked opposing quarterbacks 31 times, tied for ninth in the country and first in the NJAC. The FSU defense has also gained 18 turnovers this season, the second-best mark in the conference.

Head Coach DeLane Fitzgerald

DeLane Fitzgerald is in his fifth season at the helm of Frostburg and has pushed the program to new heights in a short amount of time. He has guided the Bobcats to 38 wins in five seasons, including 10 wins in 2016 and 11 wins last fall. Fitzgerald has increased his win total in each of his four previous seasons after inheriting a 1-9 team.

In a week four win over Rowan, Fitzgerald became the program's all-time winningest coach with 34 victories. He is the 13th head coach in the program's 58-year history.

Fitzgerald was one of 23 head football coaches hired in 2014 in Division III. Among those 23, he is third with 38 wins, but is the only coach in the group with two 10+ win seasons.

Thirty is a Magic Number

The Bobcats have scored over 30 points in six of their seven games this season, and nine of their last 10 games overall dating back to 2017. Under DeLane Fitzgerald, the Bobcats are 22-1 when scoring 30 or more.

The Rankings

Frostburg remained at sixth in both the D3football.com Top 25 Poll and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Top 25 Poll after dropping Southern Virginia 61-7 on Homecoming. FSU has been ranked inside the top 10 in both polls all season.

Tough To Come By

In his four-plus seasons at the helm, Fitzgerald has led the Bobcats to a 24-1 record when holding opponents to less than 100 yards rushing.

Frostburg has also not allowed a 100 yard rusher in any game this season.

A Win Would ...

- Lift the Bobcats to 274-281-8 overall in 58 seasons
- Land Fitzgerald his 39th victory at the helm of Frostburg
- Be Frostburg's 13th-straight regular-season road win
- Hand Frostburg its 16th win in the last 18 games away from home
- Land the Bobcats a perfect 5-0 record on the road this season
- Be Frostburg's first 8-0 start since 1993
- Land FSU its fourth-straight win over Kean

First To Score

In three of their four home games this season, the Bobcats have scored first and the 61-7 rout of Southern Virginia marked the 24th-consecutive victory when scoring first. Under DeLane Fitzgerald, FSU is 31-3 overall when having the initial score.

Road Wins

Frostburg has won its last 12 road games during the regular season. Including the NCAA Playoffs and ECAC Bowl Game, the Bobcats have collected 15 wins in their last 16 games away from Bobcat Stadium.

Block Party

Frostburg leads the country in blocked punts this season with five, while junior Malik Morris is third in the country with four blocks.

The Bobcats blocked three punts vs. William Paterson and Morris has pounced on two blocks in the endzone for touchdowns.

Since DeLane Fitzgerald took over as Frostburg's head coach in 2014, the Bobcats have blocked 27 total kicks (16 field goal/PAT attempts and 11 punts) and scored 12 special teams touchdowns (seven punt return TDs and five punt block TDs). The Bobcats are 9-0 under Fitzgerald when scoring a special teams touchdown.

I'll Take Scoring For 300

Through seven games, the Frostburg offense is averaging 41.6 points per game, leading the NJAC and sitting at 19th in the nation.

Through seven games of last year's record setting season, the Bobcats were averaging 40.5 points per contest. The '17 squad went on to set a school record with 468 points in 13 games, an average of 36 points per contest.

I'll take that

The Frostburg defense has intercepted nine passes and pounced on nine fumbles this fall, but it's the turnover margin that is most impressive.

Frostburg leads the NJAC and is eighth in Division III in turnover margin as it has turned the ball over just eight times in seven games. The Bobcats



have generated two or more turnovers in five of their seven games this season.

74 And Counting

Through eight games in his senior season, Bobcat signal caller Connor Cox is currently seventh in Division III among active quarterbacks with 74 career touchdowns.

This season, Cox has tossed 16 touchdown passes to just two interceptions.

By Land and Air

Cox is one of 10 active quarterbacks in Division III who have thrown for 4,000 yards and run for 1,000 in their career. Of those 10 QBs, Cox is fifth in total yards amassing 8,447 total yards behind 7,303 passing and 1,144 rushing yards.

Mr. 2,000

On the final play of the first quarter in the win over Rowan, senior running back Jamaal Morant ran for 10 yards and eclipsed the 2,000 yard plateau for his career. He is the eighth Frostburg player to accomplish the feat and the first since Shanorm Young ran for 2,230 from 2005-07.

Big Play Threat

Bobcat junior receiver Malik Morris is third in the nation in yards per reception at 26.88. In the season opener, he hauled in a 92-yard pass in the first quarter, while in the win over Rowan, he scored the game's first touchdown with a 68-yard pitch-and-catch from senior Connor Cox.

Last week, Morris finished with four receptions for 104 yards and two touchdowns in FSU's 61-7 rout of SVU. He finished with two catches of 40 or more yards including a 42-yard TD in the third quarter.

Pitch A Tent

The Frostburg defense has made a living in the backfield of their opponents since the beginning of the 2016 season. During those 30 games, the Bobcats are averaging 9.1 tackles for loss and 4.43 sacks per contest.

Comeback Cats

In Frostburg's 24-17 win over Montclair on Oct. 20, the Bobcats rallied from an early 3-0 deficit and trailed at halftime, 10-3, for the first time all season.

Two weeks prior, the Bobcats trailed 14-0 in the first quarter before rallying past No. 6 Wesley, 35-34. In fact, three of the seven Bobcat wins this season have come after trailing at the end of the first quarter.
