Setting the Scene

The sixth-ranked Bobcats wrap up the regular season on Saturday with the 20th Annual Regents Cup game against in-state rival Salisbury. The contest is the fourth home game of the season for Frostburg and marks the 46th meeting between the Bobcats and Sea Gulls. Frostburg is 8-0 for the first time since 1994 and for just the third time in program history. SU carries an 8-1 overall record in the matchup after falling last Saturday to Wesley in OT, 19-13.

The Bobcats are looking for their first 9-0 start since 1990 and a win would wrap up the NJAC Championship trophy and league's automatic bid to the NCAA Playoffs.

Last Saturday, Frostburg defeated Kean 50-6 behind four touchdowns in the second quarter, all coming from senior quarterback Connor Cox. The Bobcat defense limited the Cougars to just six points and 126 yards in offense.

Since the start of the 2016 season, Frostburg has won 26 of its last 28 regular-season contests and the Bobcats have won 16 of their last 18 home games dating back to the midway point of the 2015 campaign. FSU also carries a 13-game winning streak during the regular season into the game with the Gulls.

Salisbury opened the season with eight-consecutive wins before stumbling in OT last week against Wesley. Heading into the matchup with Wesley, the Gulls reached 18th in the D3football.com Top 25 poll, but have since dropped out with the loss.

Salisbury was picked to finish third in the NJAC Preseason Poll behind Wesley and Frostburg.

The Series

Today's matchup between Frostburg and Salisbury is the 46th between the two in-state rivals and the contest will serve as the 20th Annual Regents Cup game.

The longest series against any one opponent in Frostburg history, the Bobcats and Sea Gulls have met every season since 1973 and SU leads the all-time series 27-18.

Frostburg has won the last two games against SU, 14-7 in overtime and 21-17. However, Salisbury collected 12-straight wins between 2003 and 2015. The Bobcats won the first meeting back in 1973, 15-10.

Scouting Salisbury

Salisbury (8-1, 7-1 NJAC) is under the direction of head coach Sherman Wood,

who is currently leading the Sea Gulls in his 20th season at the helm. Wood, a former defensive back who lettered in all four years he played for the Sea Gulls, was named the head coach of his alma mater in 1997. With a record of 145-68, he is the all-time winningest coach in Salisbury history. In his 19 years with Salisbury, Wood has led his teams to seven NCAA Playoff appearances, five ECAC Bowl Championships and five conference championships, one of which came in the NJAC in 2015. Prior to being named the head coach of the Sea Gulls, Wood was the head coach of Division II Bowie State for six seasons, where he compiled a 21-37-1 record for the Bulldogs.

Last week, Salisbury suffered its first loss of the season, losing to Wesley at home in overtime, 19-13. The Sea Gulls held a 13-0 lead at halftime, but allowed Wesley to score the tying touchdown with 1:01 remaining in the fourth quarter and ultimately lost after a Wolverine touchdown in overtime. Salisbury's defense allowed 402 total yards of offense, 303 of which came through the air, and intercepted five passes in the losing effort.

Through nine games, the Sea Gulls are averaging 389.0 yards per game and boast the best rushing offense in the country, averaging 365.4 yards per game on the ground. Salisbury is also scoring an average of 32.3 points per game, the second-best mark in the NJAC behind Frostburg.

Senior slotback Kadarrius Campbell leads the potent rushing attack for the Sea Gulls. He has run for 678 yards and nine touchdowns in nine games this season, averaging 75.3 yards per game. Campbell splits most of his carries with fellow slotback, junior Mike-Ryan Mofor, who has 609 yards on the ground on 68 carries, for an average of 67.7 yards per game and 9.0 yards per carry. Mofor has also taken the ball in the endzone 10 times this campaign. In Salisbury's season debut, Mofor and Campbell each reached triple-digits on the ground, as Mofor carried the ball for 237 yards and two scores while Campbell added 108 yards in the Sea Gulls' 48-14 win over Albright.

Sophomore quarterback Jack Navitsky is also a threat to run the ball, as he is second on the team with 642 rushing yards and third on the team with seven rushing touchdowns. Through the air, he has completed eight of 23 attempts for 147 yards and four touchdowns. In Salisbury's game against TCNJ earlier this season, Navitsky rushed for a season-high 152 and two scores. He also made an impact through the air, throwing an 18-yard touchdown pass to senior wide receiver Matt Scott in the Sea Gulls' 38-7 victory.

Defensively, Salisbury is holding opposing offenses to just 9.6 points per game, ranked eighth in the country and first in the conference. The Sea Gulls rushing defense is almost as good as their rushing offense, allowing just 26.2 yards on the ground per game, ranked third in the nation.

Overall, Salisbury is allowing 206.0 yards per game, ranked fifth in the country and first in the conference. The Sea Gulls defense is led by junior linebacker Harold Kwigova, who leads the team with 57 tackles with nine tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks. Junior defensive lineman Matthew McFarland also has nine tackles in the backfield and leads the defensive unit with six quarterback sacks on the season.

Scouting Frostburg

Frostburg enters the game at 8-0 after its 50-6 victory over Kean last week on the road. The Bobcats are 8-0 for just the third time in the program's history and the first time since 1993, and a win against Salisbury would give the Bobcats their first ever undefeated regular season and clinch their second NJAC Title.

Head coach DeLane Fitzgerald is currently in his fifth season at the helm for the Bobcats. He is the program's all-time winningest coach with 39 wins and he led the Bobcats to the NCAA Playoffs last fall.

In last week's victory over Kean, Frostburg was propelled by a 27 point outburst in the second quarter, which was led by senior quarterback Connor Cox's three touchdown passes and a 32-yard rushing score in the quarter. Overall, Cox ended the game with 193 yards passing and 64 yards rushing to go along with his four scores in the second frame. The three touchdown passes now gives him a total of 19 on the season, best in the NJAC, and his touchdown on the ground gives him six rushing scores on the campaign.

Senior running back Grayson Boyce led the day on the ground for the Bobcats, as he collected 121 yards and two touchdowns. He also hauled in a 31-yard touchdown pass to add to his day. His classmate and fellow running back Jamaal Morant rushed the ball for 99 yards on 20 carries, bringing his total to a team-high 628 yards on the season.

The Frostburg scoring offense is currently ranked 17th in the country and first in the league, scoring 42.6 points per game.

Defensively, the Bobcats are allowing 207.1 yards per game to opposing offenses, good for the sixth-best mark in the nation and second-best in the NJAC behind Salisbury. FSU is led by senior linebacker Dre'Quan Reed, who leads the team with 50 tackles, eight of which have come behind the line of scrimmage and 4.5 sacks. Sophomore defensive lineman Zach Strand has the team lead with 8.5 tackles for losses, and his classmate and fellow lineman Carl Igweh leads the Bobcats with 4.5 sacks.

Frostburg has sacked opposing quarterbacks 33 times, tied for 11th in the country and first in the NJAC. The FSU defense has also gained 22 turnovers this season, the second-best mark in the conference.

Head Coach DeLane Fitzgerald

DeLane Fitzgerald is in his fifth season at the helm of Frostburg and has pushed the program to new heights in a short amount of time. He has guided the Bobcats to 39 wins in five seasons, including 10 wins in 2016 and 11 wins last fall. Fitzgerald has increased his win total in each of his four previous seasons after inheriting a 1-9 team.

Series:
Salisbury leads 27-17

In a week four win over Rowan, Fitzgerald became the program's all-time winningest coach with 34 victories. He is the 13th head coach in the program's 58-year history.

Fitzgerald was one of 23 head football coaches hired in 2014 in Division III. Among those 23, he is tied for second with 39 wins, but is the only coach in the group with two 10+ win seasons.

Thirty is a Magic Number

The Bobcats have scored over 30 points in seven of their eight games this season, and 10 of their last 11 games overall dating back to 2017. Under DeLane Fitzgerald, the Bobcats are 23-1 when scoring 30 or more.

The Rankings

Frostburg remained at sixth in both the D3football.com Top 25 Poll and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Top 25 Poll after dropping Kean 50-6. FSU has been ranked inside the top 10 in both polls all season.

Tough To Come By

In his four-plus seasons at the helm, Fitzgerald has led the Bobcats to a 25-1 record when holding opponents to less than 100 yards rushing.

Frostburg has also not allowed a 100 yard rusher in any game this season.

A Win Would ...

- Lift the Bobcats to 275-281-8 overall in 58 seasons
- Land Fitzgerald his 40th victory at the helm of Frostburg
- Be Frostburg's 15th win in its last 17 home games
- Hand FSU a perfect 4-0 home record this season

First To Score

In their three home games this season, the Bobcats have scored first and the 61-7 rout of Southern Virginia marked the 25th-consecutive victory when scoring first. Under DeLane Fitzgerald, FSU is 32-3 overall when having the initial score.

At Home

Frostburg has won 15 of its last 17 home games dating back to a 29-15 win over Kean during the 2015 season.

The Bobcats are currently riding a five-game winning streak at Bobcat Stadium and are outscoring their opponents by nearly 40 points during those five matchups.

Home Wins

Over the last two seasons, Frostburg has lost just once at Bobcat Stadium and is 11-1 during that span.

I'll Take Scoring For 300

Through eight games, the Frostburg offense is averaging 42.6 points per game, leading the NJAC and sitting at 17th in the nation.

Through eight games of last year's record setting season, the Bobcats were averaging 39.8 points per contest. The '17 squad went on to set a school record with 468 points in 13 games, an average of 36 points per contest.

I'll take that

The Frostburg defense has intercepted nine passes and pounced on nine fumbles this fall, but it's the turnover margin that is most impressive.

Frostburg leads the NJAC and is sixth in Division III in turnover margin as it has turned the ball over just eight times in eight games. The Bobcats have

generated two or more turnovers in five of their eight games this season.

77 And Counting

Through eight games in his senior season, Bobcat signal caller Connor Cox is currently seventh in Division III among active quarterbacks with 77 career touchdowns.

This season, Cox has tossed 19 touchdown passes to just two interceptions.

By Land and Air

Cox is one of 10 active quarterbacks in Division III who have thrown for 4,000 yards and run for 1,000 in their career. Of those 10 QBs, Cox is fifth in total yards amassing 8,687 total yards behind 7,496 passing and 1,191 rushing yards.

Big Play Threat

Bobcat junior receiver Malik Morris leads the nation in yards per reception at 26.62. In the season opener, he hauled in a 92-yard pass in the first quarter, while in the win over Rowan, he scored the game's first touchdown with a 68-yard pitch-and-catch from senior Connor Cox.

Two weeks ago, Morris finished with four receptions for 104 yards and two touchdowns in FSU's 61-7 rout of SVU. He finished with two catches of 40 or more yards including a 42-yard TD in the third quarter.

Dual Threat

Senior running back Grayson Boyce rushed for a season-high 121 yards and two touchdowns, including a 76-yard jaunt in the third quarter at Kean last Saturday. He also reeled in his second touchdown reception of the season. With his efforts on Saturday, Boyce became the first Bobcat since Chucky Iweh in 2012 to score a rushing and receiving touchdown in the same game.

500 Yards and Counting

Last week, the Bobcats racked up a season-high 502 yards of total offense in their 50-6 victory at Kean. It marks the fifth time under head coach DeLane Fitzgerald that Frostburg has accumulated over 500 yards of offense in a single game. The Bobcats' 295 rushing yards are the second-most in a single game under Fitzgerald, only behind their 385 yards at Wittenberg in the first round of the NCAA Playoffs last season.

No-Lose November

The Frostburg State football team has won eight-consecutive games in the month of November after its 50-6 victory over Kean last Saturday. The Bobcats went 3-0 in November in 2016 and 4-0 in 2017. In that stretch the Bobcats won two Regents Cups, one ECAC Bowl and two NCAA Playoff contests.
